The service empowered young people to manage their emotions and gave them the resilience. <b>Question:</b> A governor enquired whether the funding was initially for one or two years. <b>Answer:</b> It was available for one year. The Executive Headteacher explained that the agreement in place included first year fully funded, next year the federation would be required to make a contribution. <b>Question:</b> A governor enquired what the youngest children were that the charity had worked with. <b>Answer:</b> Mr Jones explained that they worked with reception children.
